First Reading

Romans 6:12-23 (NKJV)

¹² Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body, that you should obey it in its lusts. ¹³ And do not present your members as instruments of unrighteousness to sin, but present yourselves to God as being alive from the dead, and your members as instruments of righteousness to God. ¹⁴ For sin shall not have dominion over you, for you are not under law but under grace. ¹⁵ What then? Shall we sin because we are not under law but under grace? Certainly not! ¹⁶ Do you not know that to whom you present yourselves slaves to obey, you are that one's slaves whom you obey, whether of sin leading to death, or of obedience leading to righteousness? ¹⁷ But God be thanked that though you were slaves of sin, yet you obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine to which you were delivered. ¹⁸ And having been set free from sin, you became slaves of righteousness. ¹⁹ I speak in human terms because of the weakness of your flesh. For just as you presented your members as slaves of uncleanness, and of lawlessness leading to more lawlessness, so now present your members as slaves of righteousness for holiness. ²⁰ For when you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. ²¹ What fruit did you have then in the things of which you are now ashamed? For the end of those things is death. ²² But now having been set free from sin, and having become slaves of God, you have your fruit to holiness, and the end, everlasting life. ²³ For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Gospel Reading

Matthew 11:25-30 (NKJV)

P The Gospel reading is from Matthew 11:25-30.

C Sanctify us by Your truth, O LORD. Your Word is truth!

²⁵ *At that time Jesus answered and said, "I thank You, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, that You have hidden these things from the wise and prudent and have revealed them to babes. ²⁶ Even so, Father, for so it seemed good in Your sight. ²⁷ All things have been delivered to Me by My Father, and no one knows the Son except the Father. Nor does anyone know the Father except the Son, and the one to whom the Son wills to reveal Him. ²⁸ Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰ For My yoke is easy and My burden is light."*

Text: Romans 7:15-25a (NIV)

¹⁵ I do not understand what I do. For what I want to do I do not do, but what I hate I do. ¹⁶ And if I do what I do not want to do, I agree that the law is good. ¹⁷ As it is, it is no longer I myself who do it, but it is sin living in me. ¹⁸ I know that nothing good lives in me, that is, in my sinful nature. For I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out. ¹⁹ For what I do is not the good I want to do; no, the evil I do not want to do-- this I keep on doing. ²⁰ Now if I do what I do not want to do, it is no longer I who do it, but it is sin living in me that does it. ²¹ So I find this law at work: When I want to do good, evil is right there with me. ²² For in my inner being I delight in God's law; ²³ but I see another law at work in the members of my body, waging war against the law of my mind and making me a prisoner of the law of sin at work within my members. ²⁴ What a wretched man I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? ²⁵ Thanks be to God-- through Jesus Christ our Lord!

Update from the Karps – (for those of you who know Pastor Steve & Elizabeth Karp)

Dear Family and Friends,

After months of preparation, planning and packing, we are now settling into our new home in Klamath Falls, Oregon, USA.

KF is a city of about 40,000 about 15 miles north of the CA border and is located in a basin in what is called the high desert. We are hoping for a fairly mild climate although the first week we've been here has been way too hot for both of us (90sF / 30sC).

Our new home is in a subdivision in the northeast corner of KF. The houses were built in the mid 60s when a large yard with a single story bungalow and a large pad for an RV were the American dream. Our house is in the 2nd or 3rd last road before the hills begin. There is a large back yard and our dog, Bear, has found a spot under a tree to dig a large hole to keep cool. We discovered that we have 2 apple trees, half an apricot tree and a cherry tree. Lots of pruning needs to be done in time. The neighbors have been friendly and helpful.

Shopping for everyday things is quite convenient and a larger city (Medford) is an hour and a half west. The Oregon Institute of Technology is located here as well as a community college and a new hospital. It seems that there are lots of activities advertised – from live theater, an air show at the end of July, a Brats, Brews & Blues Festival in early August, lots of art galleries, a quilting competition in the fall etc.

It will take us some to unpack the hundreds and hundreds of books Steve has, as well as all of Elizabeth children's book collection and her craft supplies. It really is time to think about downsizing!

We have been blessed to find a home that meets nearly all of our "requirements" and thank our heavenly Father for that.

We are looking forward to retirement here and finally have a spare bedroom and would be happy to have you visit us.
