Confession and Absolution


We come before our Holy God recognizing that we are sinful and daily need His forgiveness.

33 For the bread of God is he who comes down from heaven and gives life to the world."


34 They said to him, "Sir, give us this bread always."


Sermon: What is Grace, Really?



"The ending first - Dave is recovering at the hospital in Vernon, feeling quite well, and hopes to be able to return home tomorrow (Thursday – Nov. 9^{th}).

The beginning as we understand it - Dave picked Julie up at work yesterday and wasn't feeling well. They went to the hospital in Vernon where the heart attack really hit and the doctors were on top of it, likely reducing damage. He was taken to Kelowna (~ 30 miles south) where he had a stint put in one of his major arteries and was brought back to the hospital in Vernon last night. As of now, the doctors would like him to take the next 6-7 weeks easy, but expect a full recovery.
