Second Reading – Mark 1:29-34 (NKJV)


- **P** The second reading is from Mark 1:29-34.



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
Service of the Sacrament

The words spoken by Jesus the night He instituted the Lord's Supper, by which our Lord assured to His Church the real presence of His body and blood in the Sacrament.




