

- Dear Jesus, we celebrate Your coming at Your birth in Bethlehem.


 We thank You for coming into our hearts by Your gift of faith,

- Lord of heaven and earth, forgive us all our sins.


 As we see the world in darkness and in need of Your light, increase our faith, love, courage, and strength.

First Reading

Romans 5:15-19; 6:23(EHV)

^{5:15} But the gracious gift is not like Adam's trespass. For if the many died by the trespass of this one man, it is even more certain that God's grace, and the gift given by the grace of the one man Jesus Christ, overflowed to the many!

¹⁶ And the gift is not like the effect of the one man's sin, for the judgment that followed the one trespass resulted in a verdict of condemnation, but the gracious gift that followed many trespasses resulted in a verdict of justification.

¹⁷ Indeed, if by the trespass of the one man, death reigned through the one man, it is even more certain that those who receive the overflowing grace of the gift of righteousness will reign in life through the one man Jesus Christ!

¹⁸ So then, just as one trespass led to a verdict of condemnation for all people, so also one righteous verdict led to life-giving justification for all people. ¹⁹ For just as through the disobedience of one man the many became sinners, so also through the obedience of one man the many will become righteous.

^{6:23} For the wages of sin is death, but the undeserved gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

- **P** The second reading is from Luke 1:67-79.
- **■** Sanctify us by Your truth, O LORD. Your Word is truth!
- ⁶⁷ His [John's] father Zechariah was filled with the Holy Spirit and prophesied:
 - ⁶⁸ Blessed is the Lord, the God of Israel,

because he has visited us and prepared redemption for his people.

- ⁶⁹ He has raised up a horn of salvation for us in the house of his servant David,
- ⁷⁰ just as he said long ago through the mouth of his holy prophets.
- ⁷¹ He raised up salvation from our enemies and from the hand of all who hate us,
- ⁷² in order to show mercy to our fathers by remembering his holy covenant,
- 73 the oath which he swore to Abraham our father,
- ⁷⁴ to grant deliverance to us from the hand of our enemies, so that we are able to serve him without fear,
- ⁷⁵ in holiness and righteousness before him all our days.
- ⁷⁶ And you, child, will be called a prophet of the Most High, because you will go before the Lord to prepare his ways,
- ⁷⁷ to give his people the knowledge of salvation by the forgiveness of their sins,
- ⁷⁸ because of God's tender mercies,
 - by which the Rising Sun from on high will visit us,
- ⁷⁹ to shine on those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace.






