Confession and Absolution

First Reading

Genesis 1:1-5; 26-27; 31; 2:1-3 (NKJV)

¹ In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. ² The earth was without form, and void; and darkness was on the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters.³ Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. ⁴ And God saw the light, that it was good; and God divided the light from the darkness. ⁵ God called the light Day, and the darkness He called Night. So the evening and the morning were the first day...²⁶ Then God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth." ²⁷ So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them...³¹ Then God saw everything that He had made, and indeed it was very good. Athanasian Creed (Selected sections - with Hymn 905 LSB)

This creed is named after St. Athanasius, a staunch defender of the Christian faith in the fourth century. It was prepared to assist the Church in combating two errors that undermined Bible teaching. One error denied that God's Son and the Holy Spirit are of one being or Godhead with the Father. The other error denied that Jesus Christ is true God and true man in one person. The Athanasian Creed continues to serve the Christian Church as a confession of our faith in the one, true, Triune God.

G Now this is the true Christian faith:

We worship one God in three persons and three persons in one God, without

mixing the persons or dividing the divine being.

For each person—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit—is distinct,

but the deity of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is one,

equal in glory and coeternal in majesty.

What the Father is, so is the Son, and so is the Holy Spirit.

The Father is uncreated, the Son uncreated, the Holy Spirit uncreated; the Father is infinite, the Son infinite, the Holy Spirit infinite;

the Father is eternal, the Son eternal, the Holy Spirit eternal;

yet they are not three who are eternal, but there is one who is eternal,

just as they are not three who are uncreated, nor three who are infinite,

but there is one who is uncreated and one who is infinite.

In the same way the Father is almighty, the Son is almighty, the Holy Spirit is almighty; yet they are not three who are almighty, but there is one who is almighty.

So the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God;


yet they are not three Gods, but one God.

So the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, the Holy Spirit is Lord;

yet they are not three Lords, but one Lord.

For just as Christian truth compels us to confess each person individually to be God and Lord,

so the true Christian faith forbids us to speak of three Gods or three Lords.




The Father is neither made nor created nor begotten of anyone. The Son is neither made nor created, but is begotten of the Father alone. The Holy Spirit is neither made nor created nor begotten, but proceeds from the Father and the Son. So there is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons; one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits.

And within this Trinity none comes before or after; none is greater or inferior, but all three persons are coequal and coeternal, so that in every way, as stated before, all three persons are to be worshiped as one God and one God worshiped as three persons.

Whoever wishes to be saved must have this conviction of the Trinity.

It is furthermore necessary for eternal salvation truly to believe that our Lord Jesus Christ also took on human flesh.

Now this is the true Christian faith:

We believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, God's Son, is both God and man. He is God, eternally begotten from the nature of the Father, and He is man, born in time from the nature of His mother, fully God, fully man, with rational soul and human flesh,


equal to the Father as to His deity, less than the Father as to His humanity; and though He is both God and man, Christ is not two persons but one, one not by changing the deity into flesh, but by taking the humanity into God; one indeed, not by mixture of the natures, but by unity in one person; for just as the rational soul and flesh are one human being, so God and man are one Christ.

He suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose the third day from the dead.

He ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty, and from there will come to judge the living and the dead...

This is the true Christian faith.

Whoever does not faithfully and firmly believe this cannot be saved.




Sermon Text: Matthew 28:16-20 (NKJV)

Prayer Before the Lord's Supper




Prayer After the Lord's Supper



Voter's Teacher Call Meeting – Today – Sunday, June 4th @ 11am – Because of a generous donation of \$75,000 given to SSLS the Board of Education held a special meeting on Thursday, May 25th to discuss the potential use of the donation, including the possibility of calling a 2nd teacher to teach kindergarten next school year. As a result of the meeting, the Board of Education has recommended extending a part-time call to teach kindergarten, and potentially lower grades, to Isaac Schmitt (who will be marrying our current teacher, Mikkela Hammond, on July 4th). The Church Council also met this past Wednesday, May 31st and have also recommended that we call Isaac Schmidt as a part-time teacher at SSLS.

In the event that we do, in fact, call Isaac, and should he accept the call, Mikkela Hammond, in light of her upcoming marriage to Isaac and in consideration of the Bible's headship principle, has requested to relinquish being principal. Both the Board of Education and the Church Council have recommended that the congregation call Pastor Luke Bernthal as principal at St. Stephen Lutheran School.
