

We come before our Holy God recognizing that we are sinful and daily need His forgiveness.


- P Let us then confess our sins to God our Father.

To those who believe in Jesus Christ He gives the power to become the children of God and gives them the Holy Spirit. They put a staff in his right hand, knelt in front of him, and mocked him by saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!" ³⁰ They spit on him, took the staff, and hit him repeatedly on his head. ³¹ After they had mocked him, they took off the robe and put his own clothes on him. 


Sermon Text: Hebrews 2:9-10 (NKJV)


