

We come before our Holy God recognizing that we are sinful and daily need His forgiveness.


- P Let us then confess our sins to God our Father.

Deuteronomy 18:15-20 (EHV)

- Glory to You, O Lord.


What shall we say then? Shall we keep on sinning so that grace may increase?

² Absolutely not! We died to sin. How can we go on living in it any longer? ³ Or do you not know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴ We were therefore buried with him by this baptism into his death, so that just as he was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too would also walk in a new life. ⁵ For if we have been united with him in the likeness of his death, we will certainly also be united with him in the likeness of his resurrection. ⁶ We know that our old self was crucified with him, to make our sinful body powerless, so that we would not continue to serve sin.


Sermon Text: Mark 1:21-28 (EHV)


Then they went into Capernaum. On the next Sabbath day, Jesus went into the synagogue and began to teach. ²² They were amazed at his teaching, because he was teaching them as one who has authority and not as the experts in the law. ²³ Just then there was a man with an unclean spirit in their synagogue. It cried out, ²⁴ "What do we have to do with you, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God!" ²⁵ Jesus rebuked the spirit, saying, "Be quiet! Come out of him!" ²⁶ The unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions, and after crying out with a loud voice, it came out of him. ²⁷ Everyone was so amazed that they began to discuss this with each other. They said, "What is this? A new teaching with authority! He even commands the unclean spirits, and they obey him!" ²⁸ News about him spread quickly through all the region of Galilee.




