

## First Reading Acts 4:1-12 (EHV)

As Peter and John were speaking to the people, the priests, the commander of the temple guard, and the Sadducees approached them. <sup>2</sup> They were very upset because Peter and John were teaching the people and proclaiming the resurrection from the dead in connection with Jesus. <sup>3</sup> They arrested them and put them in jail until the next day because it was already evening.

<sup>4</sup> But many of those who had heard the message believed, and the number of the men increased to about five thousand.

<sup>5</sup> The next day, the rulers, the elders, and the experts in the law assembled in Jerusalem <sup>6</sup> with Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, Alexander, and all the rest of the high priest's family. <sup>7</sup> After they made Peter and John stand in front of them, they began to question them: "By what power or by what name did you do this?"

<sup>8</sup> Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders of Israel, <sup>9</sup> if we are being questioned today for a kind act that was done for the lame man, as to how this man has been healed, <sup>10</sup> let it be known to all of you and to all the people of Israel that it was by the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead! By him this man stands before you healed. <sup>11</sup> This Jesus is the stone that was rejected by you builders, which has become the cornerstone.

<sup>12</sup> "There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to people by which we must be saved."






## Run-a-Thon Fundraiser for SSLS - Friday, April 26<sup>th</sup> - 11am -12pm -

This yearly tradition is a fundraiser to raise money for the school, usually aimed at getting something useful and fun. Over the past few years we've used Run-a-Thon funds to purchase things such as the playground structure, STEM kits, and new projectors for our classrooms. The kids raise money by collecting pledges to donate, based on the number of times they can do certain athletic activities (Traditionally running, hence the name).
