Confession and Absolution

- P Jesus Christ, who perfectly kept God's Law and suffered the anguish of death and hell for Your people, we confess to You our numerous faults.
- We have not always returned to give thanks for Your grace. We have not appreciated Your guidance in our lives and in our churches. We have taken Your forgiveness for granted, and have served ourselves more often than we have served You. For these sins we pray: Lord, have mercy!
- P Spirit of God, who comes to us in Word and in power to afflict the comfortable and to comfort the afflicted, we confess to You our numerous faults.
- We have not always rejoiced in Your means of grace the Gospel in Word and Sacrament. We have not honored those you have placed over us, and we have failed those you have placed under us. We have not proclaimed Your Word on every occasion and we have not prayed as we ought. For these and all other sins, we pray: Lord, have mercy!
- When we confess our sins, God is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. Jesus Christ, the Shepherd and Bishop of our souls, did not come into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved. By His perfect life, innocent death, and triumphant resurrection, He declares to you today, "Be of good cheer! Your sins are forgiven you." As a servant of Christ, therefore, and by His authority, I forgive you all your sins in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. For Jesus' sake, you are not condemned! Go and sin no more.

First Reading

Jeremiah 1:1-10 (NKJV)

The words of Jeremiah the son of Hilkiah, of the priests who were in Anathoth in the land of Benjamin, ² to whom the word of the LORD came in the days of Josiah the son of Amon, king of Judah, in the thirteenth year of his reign. ³ It came also in the days of Jehoiakim the son of Josiah, king of Judah, until the end of the eleventh year of Zedekiah the son of Josiah, king of Judah, until the carrying away of Jerusalem captive in the fifth month. ⁴ Then the word of the LORD came to me, saying: ⁵ "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you; Before you were born I sanctified you; I ordained you a prophet to the nations." ⁶ Then said I: "Ah, Lord GOD! Behold, I cannot speak, for I *am* a youth." ⁷ But the LORD said to me: "Do not say, 'I *am* a youth,' For you shall go to all to whom I send you, And whatever I command you, you shall speak. ⁸ Do not be afraid of their faces, For I *am* with you to deliver you," says the LORD. ⁹ Then the LORD put forth His hand and touched my mouth, and the LORD said to me: "Behold, I have put My words in your mouth.

Acts 20:17-32 (NKJV)

¹⁷ From Miletus he sent to Ephesus and called for the elders of the church. ¹⁸ And when they had come to him, he said to them: "You know, from the first day that I came to Asia, in what manner I always lived among you, 19 "serving the Lord with all humility, with many tears and trials which happened to me by the plotting of the Jews; 20 "how I kept back nothing that was helpful, but proclaimed it to you, and taught you publicly and from house to house, ²¹ "testifying to Jews, and also to Greeks, repentance toward God and faith toward our Lord Jesus Christ. ²² "And see, now I go bound in the spirit to Jerusalem, not knowing the things that will happen to me there, ²³ "except that the Holy Spirit testifies in every city, saying that chains and tribulations await me. 24 "But none of these things move me; nor do I count my life dear to myself, so that I may finish my race with joy, and the ministry which I received from the Lord Jesus, to testify to the gospel of the grace of God. ²⁵ "And indeed, now I know that you all, among whom I have gone preaching the kingdom of God, will see my face no more. ²⁶ "Therefore I testify to you this day that I am innocent of the blood of all men. 27 "For I have not shunned to declare to you the whole counsel of God. ²⁸ "Therefore take heed to yourselves and to all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God which He purchased with His own blood. ²⁹ "For I know this, that after my departure savage wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock. 30 "Also from among yourselves men will rise up, speaking perverse things, to draw away the disciples after themselves. 31 "Therefore watch, and remember that for three years I did not cease to warn everyone night and day with tears. ³² "So now, brethren, I commend you to God and to the word of His grace, which is able to build you up and give you an inheritance among all those who are sanctified.


