

THE INVOCATION & OPENING PRAYER


P We begin this victory service in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

RESPONSIVE READING

From the "Resurrection Chapter:" 1 Corinthians 15:51-57

- P Listen, I tell you a mystery: We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed--
- in a flash, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet.
- P For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed.
- For the perishable must clothe itself with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality.
- When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true: "Death has been swallowed up in victory."
- "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?"
- P The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law.

SCRIPTURE READINGS:

The words of this familiar Psalm remind us of the gentle care our Good Shepherd, Jesus, gives us throughout our lifetime and on into our eternal dwelling "in the house of the Lord forever" in heaven.

Psalm 23 (NKJV)

The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want. ² He makes me to lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside the still waters. ³ He restores my soul; He leads me in the paths of righteousness For His name's sake. ⁴ Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; For You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me. ⁵ You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; You anoint my head with oil; My cup runs over. ⁶ Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me All the days of my life; And I will dwell in the house of the LORD Forever.

Jesus' words at the graveside of His dear friend, Lazarus, give us the comforting assurance that because Jesus is "the resurrection and the life" we know that Tari—and we too through faith in Jesus as our Lord and Savior—will rise back to life from our graves to be with Him forever in heaven on the Last Day.

Jesus said to her [Martha], "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live. ²⁶ "And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?"







The Obituary of Theresa Jordan Bliss

Psalm 139:13-14 You formed my inward parts; You covered me in my mother's womb. ¹⁴ I will praise You, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made; Marvelous are Your works, And that my soul knows very well.

We praise God for blessing G. James and Lois Lea nee Beman Menkveld with the special gift of Theresa Claudine born to them on September 19, 1951 in Honolulu, Hawaii.

John 3:5-6 ⁵ Jesus answered, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. ⁶ "That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit.

Theresa was spiritually born again at infancy into the eternal family of God through the Sacrament of Holy Baptism and was made a partaker of God's saving grace through faith in Jesus Christ. She was confirmed in the Christian faith as a teenager.

Proverbs 14:23; 18:15; Revelation 14:13 In all labor there is profit... The heart of the prudent acquires knowledge, And the ear of the wise seeks knowledge... 'Blessed *are* the dead who die in the Lord from now on.' " "Yes," says the Spirit, "that they may rest from their labors, and their works follow them."

With the gracious help and blessing of God, Theresa graduated from Mac Arthur High School in Houston, TX in 1969. She took a Medical Center Course in 1972 and Continuing Education Courses at North Harris County College from 1974-1983. She worked at the Information Desk at the Houston Airport, as an Accounting Clerk in 1980, as a Regional Secretary from 1980-1985, as an Insurance/Billing Clerk from 1985-1987, as

a Medical Receptionist from 1987-1992, and then started working as a medical transcriptionist when the family moved to California in 1992.

Inspired by the love of God, Tari used her talents for the benefit of others, sewing to make clothing for women who were less fortunate. Besides sewing, Tari enjoyed crocheting, knitting, beading and making jewelry, and would often bring crosses she made to give away to members at St. Stephen. She would take in recyclables brought to church by others and put the money into the Women's Auxiliary treasury. Also at church, she was consistently in the kitchen setting out food and drink for fellow members. Being concerned for her neighborhood she walked around collecting discarded bottles and cans for recycling. For personal enjoyment she read books, gardened, and visited with the neighbors.

Proverbs 18:22; 31:10 ²² He who finds a wife finds a good thing, And obtains favor from the LORD.... ¹⁰ Who can find a virtuous wife? For her worth is far above rubies.

The LORD united Tari to Dan Jordan in marriage in 1970, to which marriage the couple was blessed with two children: Ambrose and Patricia. In 1987, Tari married Allen Benedict. And finally in 2013, she married Wayne Bliss and remained in this union until the Lord took Wayne home to heaven in 2023.

In the latter part of July, Tari injured her back. During back surgery, it was discovered that she had been stricken with a cancer called Multiple Myeloma. While her body quickly succumbed to this disease, yet having faith in her Savior, who conquered sin and death, she gained the victory of everlasting life in heaven. The time of Tari's life was 73 years, 11 months, and 15 days.

She was preceded in death by her Parents, Brother Kenneth Menkveld, Sister Linda Boyle, Ex-husband Dan Jordan, Husband Wayne Bliss and Niece Phoebe Isaak.
