Holy Gospel Luke 7:11-17

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the seventh chapter



¹¹Soon afterward [Jesus] went to a town called Nain, and his disciples and a great crowd went with him. ¹²As he drew near to the

gate of the town, behold, a man who had died was being carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow, and a considerable crowd from the town was with her. ¹³And when the Lord saw her, he had compassion on her and said to her, "Do not weep." ¹⁴Then he came up and touched the bier, and the bearers stood still. And he said, "Young man, I say to you, arise." ¹⁵And the dead man sat up and began to speak, and Jesus gave him to his mother. ¹⁶Fear seized them all, and they glorified God, saying, "A great prophet has arisen among us!" and "God has visited his people!" ¹⁷And this report about him spread through the whole of Judea and all the surrounding country.

A note about our communion practice for our visitors. Because Jesus teaches us that receiving the Lord's Supper together is an expression of fellowship and unity in doctrine (1 Cor. 10:16-17) and that those who receive the Lord's Supper must first examine themselves lest they receive the sacrament to their harm instead of their blessing (1 Cor. 11:27-29), we continue the ancient Church's practice of close communion: that is, we invite all those in fellowship with us in our congregation or in one of the member congregations of the CLC (Church of the Lutheran Confession) to commune with us. If you are not currently in our fellowship, we ask that you do not commune today. This is not a judgment on your faith but an expression of ours! We are glad to have you here and pastor will be happy to answer any questions you might have.
