



Coordinating Council - September 24, 2025



This brief summary of the CLC board reports is taken from the full Coordinating Council report which is **available from your pastor** and online at <u>www.clclutheran.net</u>.

Board of Doctrine (Pastor Emeritus David Schierenbeck, chair)

We gratefully acknowledge the faithful service of Pastor Mark Tiefel, who has resigned from the Board of Doctrine. We welcome newly-appointed Pastor Emeritus James Albrecht and pray for the Spirit's blessing on his labors. / The Board of Doctrine is called "to assist in the formulation of doctrinal statements." The Board of Doctrine is not involved in matters until the CLC Convention or CLC President requests it. / The board has begun a review and update of the 1980's document, Test the Spirits, a summary of the doctrinal differences between churches.

Board of Education and Publications (Pastor David Naumann, chair)

EduK8 Fund balance is \$81,000. Two congregations have received assistance from the EduK8 Fund:

1) Grace, Valentine, NE \$10,000 to maintain current staffing levels, and 2) Peace Thru Christ,
Middleton, WI, \$3,500 for curriculum materials, shelving, instructional assistance. / An Errata for the
2006 Sydow Catechism was sent to pastors. A one-page insert for the front cover of existing
Catechisms as well as a more detailed explanation of the edits in booklet form are available at the
Book House. / Ministry by Mail_sermons will now be sent out a week in advance to aid laymen who
are conducting services in a vacancy. / Due to a server migration issue, all online courses used to
help individuals achieve CLC Certification were lost. The courses are being rebuilt.

Board of Regents (Pastor John Hein, chair)

Professor David Schaller resigned his call in August 2025. The Board of Regents has begun the call process. There is an implemented plan for covering the remainder of the 2025-26 school year. / Mrs. Lydia Buck was hired as our Administrative Assistant in June 2025. / Miss Erin Franson received and accepted the call to serve as part-time female mentor. She will work closely with counselor, Mr. Steve Sydow, to help provide for the well-being of all our students on campus. / The Board of Regents directed the faculty to reduce the overall number of credits in the BS Education (BSE) program and the BA in Pre-Theological Studies (BAPS) program. The faculty recommended making Computer Science 101 an elective and removing Music 102 from both programs. For the BAPS program, they also recommended removing Biology 101, the math requirement, and the four elective credits, while adding Religion 407 and 408 and four 1-credit Introduction to Ministry courses as requirements. The Regents adopted these recommendations. / The four one-credit "Introduction to Ministry" courses are: Introduction to Soul Care, Preaching, Teaching, Counseling. / ILHS's new cell phone policy means that students may not possess, access, or use cell phones or personal

electronic devices at ILHS during the school day. / The **Academic Center geothermal flush and refill** was completed. An inline filter was installed as a preventative measure as well. Once a new heat pump and computer motherboard are installed, the project will reach completion. / **Tuition, Room & Board, and fees** remain unchanged for the 2026-2027 school year. / The Regents and the General Business Office Manager follow a defined process to address **delinquent Student Aid Fund loans** (more information is in the full report).

Board of Missions (Mr. Joel Krafft, chair)

Living Hope (Appleton, WI) is currently calling for a new resident pastor. / A video synopsis of the board's proposal for a renewed perspective and direction in the domestic mission field has been

made available to the pastors. / Traveling VBS teams helped support programs in Mapleton, ND, Morris, MN, Cheyenne, WY, Marquette, MI, Mountain View, CA, and Valentine, NE. / Missionaries Peter Evensen, Todd Ohlmann, Bruce Naumann and Paul Nolting continue in their respective fields. / Ted Quade has agreed to step back from his role as Christian School Instructor Supervisor. Missionary Naumann is in the region and will oversee the Kenya schools. Mr. Quade remains the Kinship Committee chairman. / Liberian Church of the Lutheran Confession (LCLC): Missionary Ohlmann plans to visit in November 2025. / Nigerian Church of the Lutheran Confession (NCLC): A nearly-completed seminary building will be dedicated during a November visit. / Église Évangélique Luthérienne de Confession du Togo (EELC) prepares to graduate three seminary students in November. A national pastoral conference is planned for January. / Congrégation Confessionelle Luthérienne du Congo (CCLC) has added four new congregations and pastors. Security has improved, allowing for a planned visit in 2026. / Eglise Confessionnelle Lutherienne Sainte Faille au Congo (ECLSAFACO) has received a \$1,000 MDF grant to complete legal incorporation. / The Church of the Lutheran Confession in Zambia (CLCZ) continues to work toward official registration in Zambia. Missionary Ohlmann is planning a visit in April 2026. Approved MDF grants will provide for church construction and preschool assistance for the Kalulushi congregation. / Kenyan Church of the Lutheran Confession (KCLC) There is an encouraging zeal for outreach from pastors in Kitale and Moi's Bridge. This has resulted in several new start-up congregations. / Berea Evangelical Lutheran Church of India (BELC): Missionary Ohlmann and Chairman Krafft are planning a ten-day trip in October. This will be the first test of Missionary Ohlmann's newly acquired five-year visa. / Bangladesh Lutheran Church Mission (BLCM): A new multipurpose building is near completion which will support seminary instruction. A Mission Helper Trip focused on child evangelism is planned for 2026. / Lutheran Autonomous Mission of the Philippines (LAMP): A new worship and classroom space is being prepared in a donated facility with plans to launch a Bible Institute to train future church leaders./ Iglesia Luterana Confesional Mexico (ILC): Missionary Ohlmann plans a visit planned for some time in 2026. / Kinship sponsorships are fulfilled. Ongoing aid to areas like Myanmar and Nepal has been possible as the Lord blesses the general fund to meet rising needs through careful stewardship. / The Mission Helper Program next major trip is planned for East Africa in 2026, with separate teams being led to Kenya, Zambia, and Tanzania.

Board of Trustees (Mr. Tom Lentz, chair)

Year-to-Date general fund balance is negative / **The Reserve Fund** was used to cover the FY25 deficit. The reserve balance is \$104,300. / The **General Fund Endowment** has a balance of \$243,095 / The_**Church Extension Fund (CEF)** has a net fund balance of \$6,364,616. New CEF mortgages have been approved for Mt. Zion, Detroit, MI; Zion, Ipswich/Aberdeen, SD; and Holy Trinity, West Columbia, SC. / **Offerings to the Building Fund** in two months of FY26 totaled \$54,843. Current Building Fund balance is \$2,166,527 / **FY27 Trustee Budget Proposal** includes a \$20/month increase for the remaining participants in the Old Retirement Plan, and travel expenses have been

increased to reflect inflation and the work of the Recruitment Committee. / The **FY27 CBP Budget Proposal** includes only a COLA compensation increase (2.8%). This would result in a proposed Tier 1 base salary of \$3,455 (\$4,455 Tier 2). The Board of Missions budget includes the full funding of the 3rd Foreign Missionary, even though another small portion could have been delayed until FY28.
